



**FISHERIES DOWNSTREAM OF BONNEVILLE AMENDED  
Hook and Line Fishery Continues  
(Revision adds fishing on Sunday June 12, 2011)**

Pursuant to Chapter 2 of the Fish and Wildlife Code of the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation, the Fish and Wildlife Commission has the authority to establish regulations for CTUIR ceremonial, subsistence, and commercial fisheries. Pursuant to that authority, the Fish and Wildlife Commission adopted the following regulations. These regulations shall become effective immediately, unless otherwise stated. These regulations are in addition to all previously promulgated fishing regulations.

**Fisheries Downstream of Bonneville**

**AREA:** Areas downstream of Bonneville Dam as determined by each tribes' MOU's.

**DATES:** June 6, 7, 8 and June 12, 13, 14, 15.

**OPEN HOURS:** 6 AM through 8 PM each open day.

**GEAR:** One Pole Hook and Line only for these fishing periods.

**ALLOWABLE SALES:** Chinook, steelhead, sockeye, coho, walleye, shad, yellow perch, bass, catfish, and carp may be sold or retained for subsistence. Sturgeon may not be retained in fisheries downstream of Bonneville Dam.

Sales may not occur on COE property, fish must be transported elsewhere to be sold.

Zone 6 fishing regulations remained unchanged.

**FIRST SUMMER SEASON COMMERCIAL GILLNET FISHERIES**  
**Commercial Gillnet Fishery June 16-18 and June 20-23**  
**Platform and Hook and Line Fisheries Continue**

Pursuant to Chapter 2 of the Fish and Wildlife Code of the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation, the Fish and Wildlife Commission has the authority to establish regulations for Umatilla ceremonial, subsistence, and commercial fisheries. Pursuant to that authority, the Fish and Wildlife Commission adopted the following regulations.

**SUMMER SEASON COMMERCIAL GILLNET FISHING PERIODS:**

**AREA:** All of Zone 6

**DATES:** 6:00 AM Thursday **June 16, 2011** through 6:00 PM Saturday **June 18** (2.5 days) **AND**  
6:00 AM Monday **June 20, 2011** through 6:00 PM Thursday **June 23** (3.5 days).

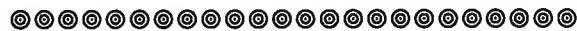
**GEAR:** There will be no mesh size restriction.

**ALLOWABLE SALES:** Chinook, steelhead, walleye, shad, yellow perch, catfish, bass, and carp may be sold or retained for subsistence. Sturgeon may not be sold, but sturgeon from 43 to 54 inches fork length in The Dalles and John Day Pools and from 38 to 54 inches fork length in the Bonneville Pool may be kept for subsistence purposes. Sales of fish caught during the open period for gillnet fishing are allowed after the end of the open period as long as the fish were landed during the open period.

**SANCTUARIES:** All standard river mouth and dam sanctuaries shall remain in effect, with the exception of the Spring Creek Hatchery sanctuary, which is not necessary this time of year. Additional gillnet fisheries are expected to be set later depending on overall catches and run sizes.



Zone 6 platform and hook and line fishing regulations remain unchanged. The Zone 6 platform and hook and line fishery continues for both commercial and subsistence use until further notice.



**FISHERIES DOWNSTREAM OF BONNEVILLE**

The tribes will continue bank only fisheries downstream of Bonneville Dam through the summer season under tribal regulations and the terms of each tribes' MOU's with the states.

**ALLOWABLE SALES:** Chinook, steelhead, sockeye, coho, walleye, shad, yellow perch, bass, catfish, and carp may be sold or retained for subsistence. Sturgeon may not be retained in fisheries downstream of Bonneville Dam.

Sales may not occur on COE property, fish must be transported elsewhere to be sold.

**Fishers should check with their tribe for specific regulations concerning open days, hours, fishing areas, and allowed gears.** Non-treaty sport fishing will be ongoing in this area.
